Entry Information

Registrations must be submitted online on the <u>Skate Virden Uplifter Registration platform</u>. Registrations will be accepted until Sunday, December 3, 2023 at 11:45 pm. (CST).

For technical difficulties with registration on Uplifter, please contact sk8virden@gmail.com. When emailing, please include a clear screenshot of the error or difficulty. Email communication is preferred.

Skaters are strongly encouraged to register well ahead of the deadline so if assistance is required, there will be time to resolve the issue prior to the close of registration.

Any registrations after Sunday December 3, 2023 will be subject to Registrar approval and an additional fee of \$50 will be added.

No registrations will be accepted after 11:45 pm. (CST) on Sunday December 10, 2023.

NOTE: Planned Program information MUST be submitted at the time of registration, including music.

Refund Policy

Refunds will be given up to and including the registration deadline of December 3, 2023 however, they will be subject to a \$50 administrative and online processing fees. No Refunds will be given after the closing date of December 3, 2023. NO medical refunds at any time after the close of entries (registration deadline, December 3, 2023). In the event that officials are not available for the CPC judged events, a full refund will be provided including the administrative and online processing fees.

- All events are subject to the availability of officials and if numbers warrant.
- An Officials Development fee of \$3.00 per event, per competitor, will be added to each registration at the time of payment.
- A Technology Fee of \$5.00 per competitor will be added to each registration at the time of payment. Please note there is no technology fee for CanSkate events.

Onsite Registration

Skaters are expected to register no later than 1 hour before their event but no earlier than 45 minutes prior to the first event of the day.

Music will NOT be submitted at the registration desk. Please see the 'Music' section below for more information about back up music.

Judging System

The Assess to Standard Judging System will be used for Star 1-4, Improv 1&2, CanSkate and Synchro Star 3-8. For more information about Assess to Standard please see Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Assess to Standard</u>. The Cumulative Points Calculation (CPC) Judging System will be used for Star 5-8 and Synchro Novice and Adult events. For more information about CPC please see Skate Canada Rule Book, <u>Scoring of Skate Canada Competitions</u>.

Skate Canada Coach Information

A maximum of two coaches per entry will be accredited. A maximum of two coaches will be allowed at ice level – determined by the skater/team.

It is the responsibility of the coach(es) to ensure that they meet the requirements to be able to attend a competition with their athlete. <u>Please click here</u> for important information surrounding certification requirements, requesting special permission, and accreditation at the event.

Draws

Draw for the Starting Order for the First Segment of the Event

The starting order of the competitors for each Event will be randomly drawn in cooperation with the Technical Representative. The draw may be done manually or by computer. See Skate Canada Rule Book, Competitions, Section 3; Conduct of an Event.

Music

All music used must be in the public domain or covered by the performing rights societies. Competitors who have music composed specifically for their programs either wholly or in part, are responsible for obtaining a written release from the composer for the use of such music on radio and/or television or appropriate clearance from the performing rights societies.

Music Requirements:

Music must be received at time of registration in MP3 format by the registration deadline. There will be an upload section on the PPC you will complete.

Team Managers for Synchro must submit music on behalf of their team when they register at the competition.

The music downloaded must include the skater's full name and the event in which they are registered to skate. Example: M Mouse/Senior/Free Program

NEW: Competitors will <u>NOT</u> hand in their back up music at the time of registration. Skaters will hold onto their music and keep it on their persons, or with their board side accredited coach. In the event that the back-up music is required by the Audio Technician, the skater or coach will deliver the music to the Audio Technician.

The back up music must be on a USB memory stick. <u>CDs will NOT be accepted</u>. A memory stick may contain multiple programs however, it must be properly labeled. No alternate electronic items such as iPhone, tablets, MP3 players etc. will be accepted.

Accidents/Liability

Skate Virden, Skate Manitoba Section, Skate Canada and the volunteer team undertake no responsibility for damages or injuries suffered by skaters. As a condition of and in consideration of their entries in this competition, all competitors and their parents or guardians shall be deemed to agree to assume all risks or injuries to the competitor's person and property resulting from, or caused by or connected with, the conduct and management of the competitions and to release any and all claims they may have against the officials, the association, the Skate Canada, The Skate Virden Club, the volunteer team and against their officers and their entries shall be accepted only on these conditions.

Medical Services & Injury Reporting

Medical Services available to skaters will be located in a designated area on-site. Ice level first aid personnel will be available for the duration of practice and competition.

Camera Policy

Flash photography is not permitted while athletes are on the ice during practice or competition. Skate Manitoba restricts the use of cameras and video equipment during Skate Canada Sanctioned events out of respect for the safety and to protect the privacy of competing athletes.

Coaches are only permitted to video tape their own skater from the boards during that skater's practice or performance. For full policy, please see our Standing Rules, A.121 Governance, Camera Policy
